On July 1, the township completed the lengthy process and me to get information accepted the donation of all property and remaining financial assets of the Big Rock Welsh Cemetery. The Welsh cemetery

on Rhodes is now owned and operated under the oversight of the township The Illinois State Comptroller is completing a final audit of funds board. previously held by the Welsh Cemetery Association, but all remaining cemetery funds have been received by the township.

A similar transition of the Fowler Grove Cemetery on Granart southwest of Jericho Road is nearly complete. We awaiting the transfer of the remaining funds, burial records and completion of the final state audit. The Fowler Grove transition should be completed and transferred to the township around September 1. A third cemetery, Big Rock West Cemetery located on Shaw Road, will remain privately owned and operated.

Well summer is almost over and so we are starting our 3rd round of mowing. We have been hauling and building up the roads on the south side of town and will be moving on to the north roads soon. We will be hot and cold patching blacktop and tar and chip roads, so be safe and keep us safe while working along sides of roads. See you at the Plowing Match, hopefully!

Last month, we began a general cleanup of the Welsh cemetery grounds, with removal of the rusted chain link fence, trimming dead trees and bushes, and removal of the broken sign. The fence will not be replaced to provide an open and peaceful setting, and a new sign will be installed in the future.

Funds received by the township will be sufficient to maintain and improve both Welsh and Fowler Grove for many years without the need for any new cemetery taxes. All cemetery funds received by the township are held in bank accounts separate from the regular township operating funds.

We are removing the two large pine trees which are too close to the town hall building in the coming week in order to power wash and repaint the building exterior this fall. PROPERTY MAINTENANCE/ZONING ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

Property maintenance standards have been & will continue to be a priority of the village. The villages zoning enforcement/property maintenance officer is onsite weekly to help as needed. He will make sure to properly identify himself at all times when visiting any property(s), but know he will be making drives throughout the community on a regular basis. He will be doing what has been instructed of him by the village board. These topics are always openly discussed in our meetings if you should have interest. It's been heard loud & clear by many, many residents what they want to see, "things to be cleaned up!!". Enforcement officers will be utilizing and referring to the Village Of Big Rock "Property Maintenance Code" and doing compliance checks accordingly. Please let us know if you have any questions/concerns.

VILLAGE POLICING

The Village has heard and witnessed firsthand for many years traffic that comes through our small town driving at speeds well above our posted speed limits. As a result the village entered into an agreement with Kane County to police our community paying special attention to speeding. A Kane County officer will randomly be patrolling within Big Rock during high traffic times paying special attention to violators on Rte 30, Rhodes Rd, and Granart Rd. The village hopes that with more police presence/enforcement that this will slow people down and make our community roads safer to be on.



STEP (SEPTIC TANK EFFLUENT PUMP) SYSTEM MAINTENANCE

Please know that the village has a contractor that will be performing regular (annual) maintenance/pumping of the village tanks on private property. These tanks are identified by the "green" riser lids that are located in resident(s) yards. Contractor's will be identified by wearing village labeled lanyards and/or bright yellow safety vests. Should you have any questions or concerns please call the village office and we will assist in verification of work being performed on septic tank located on your property. Additionally the village will continue to do inspections to uncover illegal water softener/sump pump discharge into the village sanitary sewer system. These items must be re-routed to the exterior of your home and/or ditch way. The STEP system was designed only to treat "grey" water that is discharged from a property and NOT softener brine and/or ground water (sump pump discharge). Notification(s) have been sent to residents on several occasions prior to emphasize bringing your property up to village code. On certain occasions residents have had to re-direct plumbing within their homes to ensure proper drainage of softeners & sump pumps to storm water drains. The village and residents must work together to keep our system running efficiently & smoothly for years to come in order to keep costs down. Please contact the village office for additional questions/concerns.

DOOR TO DOOR SOLICITATION

The Village has no ordinance against solicitors. With this being said we have received a few complaints of individual solicitors that are going door to door possibly representing themselves as village employees or having received a village endorsement for their specific sale(s). In ALL cases this is un-true! The Village of Big Rock does not partake in any door to door sales with/for our residents. The village can only suggest that if you are receiving unwanted solicitations on your property to place a sign on your door that clearly states: "no solicitors". If you have any questions about this please contact the village office directly.

Please visit us during office hours or stop by for an upcoming meeting. They are very informative and productive evening meetings starting at 7 p.m. on the second and fourth Tuesday of every month. Agendas are always posted in advance at the Park District & Post Office if you're curious as to what's going to be covered. And remember at every meeting we have a "public" session where you or anyone can address any topic. All constructive feedback will be taken into board considerations.

September is the month to sign up for a library card. For a very small annual fee, there is an abundance of materials available for your listening or reading pleasure. Big Rock Library has over 12,000 items in the collection for toddlers through adults. We have e-books available at no cost through eRead Illinois which has 42,960 titles for adults & children. 31,703 are e-books and 12,257 are e-audiobooks. There is interlibrary loan for titles we can borrow from other libraries. Besides books, there are music CDs, a variety of DVDs, audiobooks on CD, and lots of children's materials.

Parents, give your students a headstart with a library card. Having their own card teaches responsibility and gives them the opportunity to read titles beyond the school library.

Stop by and check out the library for yourself.

Visit the library during plowing match and participate in all sorts of activities. For kids, there is a scavenger hunt (searching for items with your phone or camera) and get a coupon for cider donuts at Kuiper's Family farm. HSBR CUST #429 • UPDATES AND HIGHLIGHTS

Did you know that beginning in the 2020-2021 school year, a new high school graduation requirement will be in place for all students in Illinois? Public Act 101-0180 requires seniors across Illinois to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or file a waiver to the school district stating they understand the FAFSA and have chosen not to file an application. While this does not apply to the HBRHS Class of 2020, it will apply to all future classes.

Mandated or not, the completion of the FAFSA is a great idea for anyone planning, or even investigating, postsecondary education. The 2019-20 FAFSA can be completed starting October 1, 2019, utilizing 2017 income information (ISAC, n.d.). There continues to be a great misconception related to the completion of the FAFSA; FAFSA only benefits those who need financial aid from the federal government, and many believe that their parents make

too much money. Most financial aid in the United States is awarded by post-secondary institutions rather than the government. Many colleges also require the FAFSA to be on file for their own scholarships. Additionally, the completion of a FAFSA must be filled for a student to participate in the Federal Work-Study program. This program helps provide part-time jobs for undergraduate and graduate students to help pay for educational expenses.

Did you know that...

- about 44.7 million Americans owe over \$1.56 trillion (up from \$1.48 trillion the year before) in student loan debt?
- the average Class of 2019 college graduate has \$29,800 in student loan debt.
- the average monthly student loan payment is \$393 with the median coming in at \$222.

(Student Loan Hero, 2019)

This data builds the case for completing the FAFSA. You never know what scholarships, grants, loans, or work study you may be eligible to receive!

So here's what HBR is planning on doing to help:

- HBRHS will host a FAFSA Completion Night on Monday, 10.7.19 (6:00-7:30 pm), in the Hinckley-Big Rock High School Library. Parents are encouraged to bring their financial documentation and actually complete the online application with a representative from ISAC and HBRHS staff available to provide any needed assistance.

If you are a senior at HBRHS, are the parent of a senior at HBRHS, or you yourself are considering post-secondary training, mark your calendars and plan on attending our FAFSA Completion Night on Monday, 10.7.19 at HBRHS. We are here to help in preparing for our students'/community's tomorrow.

Many young adults are now vaping as an alternative to smoking cigarettes. Because they use water vapor, vapes are viewed as being "safe." But they are not as safe as many people think. Here are the facts:

- Vapes allow the user to inhale nicotine, but instead of burning tobacco, vapes heat liquid nicotine to make a vapor.
- Nicotine is as addictive as cocaine or heroin.
- Nicotine in any form damages blood vessels and increases the risk of heart disease. It also affects brain development.
- The vapor used in these devices is not just made up of water and nicotine. It is an aerosol mist of toxic chemicals that can include formaldehyde, heavy metals such as nickel, tin or lead and other harmful chemicals.
- Pod vapes, made by companies such as JUUL, Suorin and others look like USB drives or lighters. They often come in flavors, which makes them appear harmless.
- Most flavored vapes have nicotine. Some pod vapes have as much nicotine as an entire pack of cigarettes. Those advertised as "nicotine-free" have been found to contain nicotine. Even those without nicotine still contain chemicals to enhance the flavor.
- Vape companies use deceptive advertising such as "Safe Cigs" or "Calorie-Free Flavor" or "Vape Your Dessert" to make you think vaping is a safe, sweet treat.
- Studies show that teens who try vapes are twice as likely to smoke regular tobacco cigarettes.
