CALL TO ORDER

President Matt Fitzpatrick called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

President Fitzpatrick led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

MOMENT OF SILENCE

President Fitzpatrick asked for a moment of silence in honor of our Armed Forces and their Allies.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

William McMahon, Progressive Business Solutions, made a presentation about energy options for the Village of Big Rock's sewer plant. The Village has worked with this company in the past, and they shop around for the best energy cost on our behalf. The Village will decide if they will extend the contract and for how many years.

Nathan Schachter, Eagle Scout, asked the Village for a donation of up to \$1,000 for his Eagle Scout Project. He is planning to build a life-size chess board with brick pavers with weighted Chess pieces in the Big Rock Park, with installation in mid-August.

Darrin Boyer, Sewer Plant Manager, gave a very technical report of recent concerns about the distribution valves in the plant. He has been investigating and wanted to get the Board's approval to use more time to troubleshoot to resolve the issue so the plant's nitrification levels do not exceed standards. He outlined the process with best- and worst-case scenarios, as well as who he would hire to speed the process along, as he suspects the levels could exceed standards by the end of the month. The Board verbally agreed that he should take the time and steps necessary to solve the issue.

President Fitzpatrick asked **Mr. Boyer** his opinion of adding the sewer system to the Village's GIS system map. **Mr. Boyer** said that it is a very useful and powerful tool in many ways. He outlined the benefits of including the sewer system into GIS Mapping, as it would allow complaint and maintenance notes, reports of data and backups, building and zoning utilization and much more. He noted that he has the tools to get our Village mapped out in a day, making it easy to add it to the GIS map system.

They completed an inspection by code enforcement to verify compliance but unfortunately they have failed compliance with the lighting ordinance.
